

# Tri-County Sporting Clays League Scoring Protocol 2016-2017

## Scoring:

1. Scores can only be changed with proof of error from original score sheet from host club. This must be done within two weeks of the scoring error so be sure to check scores frequently.
2. Category of shooter has precedence over class of shooter, i.e. someone winning Jr division and “B” class will receive the Jr division award and the “B” class award will go to the next appropriate shooter.
3. Shooter can only win one category or class that is sponsored by the league.
4. Shooters class for the year is calculated by using their previous year’s final average (with 2 lowest dropped) unless they missed more than 2 shoots then only actual scores from the previous year (zeros not included) are used to determine their average. The 6 classes were determined by using a Lewis Class formula. The shooters were divided evenly among 6 classes, that is; Master, AA, A, B, C & D
5. Shooter must attend 10 of 12 shoots to be eligible for league sponsored awards.
6. New shooters must shoot once at all four clubs before being classified.
7. Any shoot that is missed can be made up under the following rules.
  - a. The shoot can only be made up at the club that was or will be missed.
  - b. The shooter must declare the make-up prior to shooting any targets that day.
  - c. The squad placement for the make-up will be at the sole discretion of the host club.

Only one shoot at each of the participating clubs can be shot in advance or made up. Any other missed shoots will be scored a zero and those scores will be used in determining the shooters final average for award consideration.

8. League final scoring for the 2016-2017 league will be based on the highest 10 of 12 scores.
9. Shooters will be allowed 2 “failures to fire” or “No Birds” (broken targets, out of bounds, etc.) per 50 target round. If there is either a failure to fire or a “No Birds” (broken target, out of bounds, etc) on any pair, any targets shot at and broken or not broken are established and the pair must be shot over to establish the score for the remaining target.
10. The Rookie Class will not be used in determining the weekly individual club average.

## Class Designations:

Master	41.20 and up
AA	39.00 to 41.19
A	37.30 to 38.99
B	35.50 to 37.29
C	31.60 to 35.49
D	31.59 and under
Rookie	average less than 20.00

## Category Designations:

Shooters age at the start of the league will be the determining factor.

Jr.	18 and under
Vet.	Age 60-65
Sr. Vet.	Over Age 65
Rookie	New shooter or a shooter who’s prior year’s weekly average was under 20. A new shooter can “opt out” of Rookie at their discretion.

**Club Champion Calculations:** The scores of shooters in the Rookie Class WILL NOT be used in calculating the weekly club average. All shooters other than Rookie class will be used in calculating the club average each week.
